Who is making the decision when to reopen?

The Reopening committee, based on the graphs in the upcoming slides, will recommend when to open to the Board. The Board will make the decision.

What did you base the guidelines on?

The Reopening committee used the WI Council of Churches for their guidelines. The WI Council of Churches used the WI Department of Health and the CDC to put together their guidelines. UUA recommends we use state guidelines and CDC.

under 50%

Positive Tests < 10%

Small Groups Only

IF a small group chooses to meet in person:

UU related groups

Masks mandated

6' physical distancing

Sign in - attendance list (necessary for contact tracing)

10 people maximum

Limited times are available - Schedule with Sara

Vaccination recommended

No more than 1 meeting per day

High contact areas to be cleaned after use

Bathrooms to be cleaned, if used

Offer alternative to members who choose not to meet in person

Safer to meet outside if weather permits

Kitchen is closed

Viral Transmissions for DC and WI
Cases <5/ 100,000
Positive tests < 5%

Could we reopen and then have to close again?

The answer is Yes. We are advised to keep our plans loose and be prepared to phase back if necessary.

Can we, or should we, require people to be vaccinated?

We cannot require people to be vaccinated. We could ask people, but it is their right to tell us or not. We are still struggling with this question, but for now, we are not asking.

What if I am not comfortable attending in person?

We are working on a way for us to be both in person and digitally.

Stay tuned as we work out the kinks of doing this. Unfortunately, we have some time, as the numbers in Door County are too high for us to reopen at this time.

Can we meet outside at a different risk level than which would be required to meet inside?

In general, outside is the safer alternative. Masks and distancing would still be recommended.

Who will make sure that masks are worn and that the building is cleaned between events?

If a small group meets, one person would be determined to be in charge of protocols. When we reopen the entire building, we will need numerous volunteers to assume these responsibilities.
